

Eligible Activities

The activities listed below are approved by the school board for the completion of the community involvement requirement.

Students can seek opportunities to help

- In the community by offering assistance to charities, service clubs, and other not-for-profit organizations. Examples include *fundraising, assisting in a senior's residence, coaching, participating in environmental projects, organizing community events and church sponsored activities, organizing and participating in cultural activities, assisting local meals on wheels programs, participating in 4H Club service activities, etc.*
- In the school by helping out in extra-curricular activities. Examples: *organizing tournaments, assisting other students, library assistant, technical crew for school productions, participating in school governance, fundraising, organizing drama or art events etc.* Students may also help out by contributing to and participating in school sanctioned activities (e.g., *Terry Fox Run, etc.*)
- individuals by providing assistance to people in need. For example: *assisting local seniors, child care, assisting students with special needs, student representation on boards, advisory committees, transcribing for students with special needs, tutoring through electronic means, etc.*
